

2021-22 Breakfast Prices - White Settlement ISD

GOOD NEWS! ALL WSISD Students will receive **FREE MEALS** for the 2021-2022 school year! Students may have one free breakfast meal and one free lunch meal per day.

IMPORTANT: We ask that you go ahead and complete a Free/Reduced Meal Application for this school year. This will ensure that you will receive benefits for the first 30 days of the 2022-23 school year. You may also qualify for additional benefits (PEBT). WSISD receives additional funding for students based on those who qualify for the free and reduced meal program.

To be charged the meal price (instead of à la carte pricing) the student must take at **least 3 items** out of the 4 or more offered and one of those components must be a fruit or juice.

The **four items** are: **Bread/Grain** (and/or Meat/Meat Alternate) which counts as **2 items**; Examples: Omelet; Biscuit; Pancakes; Egg Sandwich; Cereal and Toast; Cinnamon Roll. **Fruit choices** may have up to 2 fruits or 1 fruit and 1 juice; **and Milk choice**. A fruit choice must be taken with the meal, it can be placed on a “share table” if they cannot eat fruit or drink juice.

À la carte prices will be charged if less than 3 items are selected or if a fruit or juice is not taken.
